ENTSO-E has a legal obligation to report on the 70% rule every 3 years

In June 2023, ENTSO-E published its market report (incl. the CEP70 reporting).

The report provides an overview of the national assessments of the 70% rule for external stakeholders Acknowledging that NRAs are responsible for assessing TSOs compliance with the CEP70 provision: the report clearly distinguishes between TSOs calculations and NRAs compliance decisions.

The report covers 2022. The main findings can be found in the main body of the report, while detailed country-by-country assessments are provided in the annex.

The compliance and monitoring responsibilities are organized on a national level at NRAs, including the publication of national monitoring reports. ENTSO-E has the legal obligation to report on the '70%-rule' in the context of the Technical Report every 3 years (Article 14.2 of the Electricity Regulation (CEP70)). Although there is no legal obligation to publish such an overview every year (only every 3 years), ENTSO-E publishes every year an overview on the national monitoring of the 70%, as part of ENTSO-E market report



Main Conclusions CEP70 in 2022

The report shows a high level of fulfillment of the CEP70 criteria on many borders.

The implementation of CORE DA-Flow Based Market Coupling led to a harmonized and more efficient application of minimum cross-zonal trading capacities on 19 borders in Central Europe.

In comparison to 2021, an reduction of derogations used is observed.
