Legal requirements for the ACER process

Article 59(11) of the Electricity Regulation

- ACER shall revise the proposed NC to ensure that the NC to be adopted
 - complies with the relevant FG and
 - contributes to market integration, non-discrimination, effective competition, and the efficient functioning of the market and,

submit the revised NC to the Commission within six months of receipt of the proposal.

- In the proposal submitted to the Commission, ACER shall
 - take into account the views provided by all involved parties during the drafting of the proposal led by the ENTSO-E or the EU DSO entity and
 - shall consult the relevant stakeholders on the version to be submitted to the Commission.

Ensure necessary level of harmonisation and consistency with existing legislation.



ACER process for revision/recommendation

May

• 8 May: EU DSO entity and ENTSO-E submit the proposal to ACER

Jun-Jul

- 7 Jun 6 Aug: ACER public consultation (tbc)
- 1st week of July: ACER public workshop (tbc)

Aug-Sep

- ACER/NRAs process public consultation comments
- · Further amendments to the draft

Oct

- ACER/NRAs orientation discussions
- · Finalisation of the recommendation

Nov-Dec

- 18 Dec: ACER Board of Regulators meeting
- 20 Dec: submission to the EC




Stakeholders involvement in the ACER process

- During the ACER process (from May until Dec) there is a public consultation (with a public workshop).
- Apart from reaching out to the general public for collecting comments, we intend to use also the existing stakeholders' fora:
 - for expert input, the drafting committee (on specific topics), with the aim of evolving/transforming it into the structure envisaged in the DR NC (currently Article 15);
 - updates in MESC meetings: 13 June, 8 October, 3 December.
- Given that by May we will have identified also some topics that ACER/NRAs would require more input also from the SOs, we would also appreciate technical meetings/calls (with the SOs, but also extended to drafting committee members, depending on the topic).



European harmonisation process




- In the context of the DR NC, a process is foreseen for further harmonisation when and where is needed in the future.
- This will be achieved with regular assessments of the relevant elements and the different practices.
- An important tool in this process is the ACER barriers study, while regular input is also needed by the stakeholders.

ACER MMR barriers to demand response


Regularly:
