

Frequently Asked Questions

This document aims at answering the most common questions raised by Project Promoters

Questions	Answers
How to get a login and password to access the TYNDP 2022 Projects Platform?	Promoters who do not have access to the platform can request a login and password to the Single Point of Contact (SPOC) Ilaria.garampi@entsoe.eu
In TYNDP 2020 it was possible to exclude the projects from CBA using the option “opt out”. Will such an opportunity be in the current process?	No, it will not be possible to opt out of receiving a CBA assessment in the TYNDP 2022 process. All projects will be assessed.
In TYNDP 2020 only CBA Light/Market CBA was performed for the concept projects with commissioning date ≥ 2035 . Is it still valid for TYNDP2022?	Yes, in TYNDP 2022 a light (market-only) CBA will be performed for projects with commissioning year beyond 2034 (= 2035 and above). Ref. Section 4.3 of the TYNDP 2022 Guidance for Applicants .
Where can I find the recordings and slides of the webinars for project promoters?	Recordings and slides of past webinars are available on the Promoters’ corner .
What is the field in the projects platform “This project is no longer relevant for TYNDP (e.g. commissioned, cancelled etc)”?	It appears for every project and you can tick it only if the project is no longer relevant. This field is meant to allow promoters who have multiple projects in our database to easily see which of their projects are still relevant, and which are commissioned/cancelled/drafts projects or projects created in the platform by mistake.
What exactly is the promoter’s Single Point of Contact?	The Single Point of Contact (SPOC) is the contact person for each project, who is responsible to receive communications from ENTSO-E for all promoters of that project.
To what extent does TYNDP 2022 you include battery storage projects?	We welcome applications from battery storage projects. The project has to provide at least 225 MW installed capacity and must have a storage capacity that allows a net annual electricity generation of 250 GWh/year. For more information, promoters can refer to the TYNDP 2022 Guidance for Applicants page 17-19.

When does ENTSO-E plan to publish the draft list of projects admitted in the TYNDP2022?

The provisional list of projects admitted to the TYNDP 2022 will be published on ENTSO-E's website in December 2021.

All project promoters will receive an individual notification about the acceptance / rejection of their application.

Can several promoters view and edit the same project (of which they are jointly promoters) in the TYNDP Projects Platform?

Yes, it is possible for several promoters to view a project on the TYNDP project submission form online. To provide access to other promoters of your project, please contact us with the project number and the email address of the person who needs access to the project.

Where to find information about projects present in TYNDP 2020?

After submission to TYNDP, what are the next steps for project promoters?

The publication of the draft TYNDP 2022 portfolio is expected in December 2021. In early 2022 we will:

- Organise a webinar for promoters on the TYNDP 2022 timeline and next steps
- Release the TYNDP 2022 Implementation Guideline by early February 2022
- Inform promoters on project-level indicators. The deadline to compute them is expected in May 2022.
- Consult promoters on planned improvement to TYNDP 2022 project sheets

In the Spring of 2022 we will allow promoters to edit the information appearing in their project sheets.

Release of the cost-benefit analysis results is expected in Q3 2022.

Will it be possible to submit project-level indicators in TYNDP 2022 like in TYNDP 2020?

Yes, it will be possible. We will provide more information (also about deadlines) to project promoters in January / early February 2022. We also plan to organise webinars for project promoters on project-level indicators.

Will ENTSO-E organise other webinars and/or workshops

Yes, we will organise webinars and/or workshops to provide practical live demonstration and answer questions on topics including the next steps in the TYNDP

When does ENTSO-E plan to share CBA results with project promoters?

We plan to share CBA results in September for consultation with project promoters.

Upon review of these results, project promoters may have questions or queries. Promoters may send questions and comments by email or request a bilateral meeting with ENTSO-E’s TYNDP team by emailing the SPOC Ilaria.garampi@entsoe.eu. This request should include a brief description of the topics and issues that the project promoter wishes to discuss and the project promoter’s upcoming availability.

Which studies will ENTSO-E perform on projects in TYNDP 2022?

All projects included in the TYNDP 2022 will be assessed, with either a market-only or a full (market and network) CBA, depending on the commissioning year of the project (see the table below).

What if a project promoter wishes to remove his/her project from TYNDP 2022?

The project promoter should inform ENTSO-E SPOC (Ilaria.garampi@entsoe.eu) if they wish to remove a project from TYNDP 2022.

The project promoter missed the deadline to submit my project. Is it still possible to add the project to TYNDP 2022?

No, it is no longer possible. The promoter can only submit the project in TYNDP 2024.
