How to get a login and password to access the TYNDP 2026 Projects Platform?

Promoters who do not have access to the platform can request a login and password to the Single Point of Contact (SPOC) tyndp@entsoe.eu.

Where can I access the TYNDP Projects Platform?

TYNDP Projects Platform can be accessed following this <u>link</u>.

Where can I find information on how to create/edit a project in the platform?

ENTSO-E will release a user guide for promoters before the projects' submission window.

What is the field in the projects platform "This project is no longer relevant for TYNDP (e.g. commissioned, cancelled etc)"?

It appears for every project and you should tick it only if the project is no longer relevant for the TYNDP process. This field is meant to allow promoters who have multiple projects in our database to easily

see which of their projects are still relevant, and which are commissioned/cancelled/drafts projects or projects created in the platform by mistake.

Can several promoters view and edit the same project (of which they are jointly promoters) in the TYNDP Projects Platform?

Yes, it is possible for several promoters to view a project on the TYNDP project submission form online. To provide access to other promoters of your project, please contact us with the project number and the email address of the person who needs access to the project.

Which projects can apply to TYNDP 2026?

For the TYNDP 2026 cycle, promoters can submit transmission, storage, offshore hybrid and radial projects. Offshore hybrid projects are projects that have dual purpose of interconnecting markets and integrating offshore RES generation capacity. Offshore radial projects are projects located in a sea basin, as defined in the TEN-E.

To what extent does TYNDP 2026 include battery storage projects?

We welcome applications from battery storage projects. The project has to provide at least 225 MW installed capacity and must have a storage capacity that allows a net annual electricity generation of 250 GWh/year.

Will hybrid offshore projects be considered in the TYNDP 2026 CBA Implementation Guideline?

Yes, the Implementation Guideline contains a part dedicated to hybrid offshore projects and the different modalities to assess them.

Will it be possible to submit project-level indicators in TYNDP 2026 like in TYNDP 2024?

Project Level Indicators (PLIs) are cycle-specific and are indicators left to the discretion of the project promoter to compute due to several reasons (e.g. non-availability of a pan-European assessment methodology or tool for computing the indicator, low maturity of the indicator, etc.). A revised version of the TYNDP CBA Implementation guidelines for the TYNDP 2026 cycle (to be released in Q4 2025) should specify what PLIs are to be considered for this cycle and likewise, further information on the computation and the submission process should be provided.

Which studies will ENTSO-E perform on projects in TYNDP 2026?

All projects included in the TYNDP 2026 are assessed, with either a market-only CBA or a full (market and network) CBA, depending on the scenario. Further information regarding target years assessed and the scenarios considered in the projects CBA phase will be provided during the process.

When does ENTSO-E plan to publish the draft list of projects admitted in the TYNDP 2026?

The provisional list of projects admitted to the TYNDP 2026 is planned to be published in January 2026.

An updated list will be released with the TYNDP 2026 for public consultation in October 2026.

After submission to TYNDP, what are the next steps for project promoters?

- Publication of the draft TYNDP 2026 Project Portfolio (Q1 2026)
- Webinars for project promoters on the next steps of the TYNDP 2026 process (dates will be announced on the <u>Promoters' corner</u>.)
- Webinar for project promoters on project level indicators (Q2 2026)
- Webinar for project promoters on project sheets (Q3 2026)
- Project-level indicators' submission window for promoters (Q3 2026)
- CBA results are shared with project promoters for a two-week review period (Q4 2026)
- Release of TYNDP for public consultation (Q4 2026)

When will ENTSO-E publish TYNDP 2026 Scenarios?

Draft Scenarios are planned to be published in Q1 2026. After a 3-month review period by ACER and a subsequent 3-month review period by the European Commission, ENTSO-E and ENTSOG will publish the final TYNDP 2026 Scenarios.

When does ENTSO-E plan to share CBA results with project promoters?

CBA results are expected in Q4 2026. Upon review of these results, project promoters may have questions or queries. Promoters may send questions and comments by email or request a bilateral meeting with ENTSO-E's TYNDP team by emailing us at tyndp@entsoe.eu. This request should include a brief description of the topics and issues that the project promoter wishes to discuss and the project promoter's upcoming availability.

The project promoter missed the deadline to submit its project. Is it still possible to add the project to TYNDP 2026?

No, it is no longer possible. The promoter can only submit the project in TYNDP 2028.

Webinars or workshops will take place at key steps of the TYNDP process, including at the time of release for consultation of the draft CBA Implementation Guidelines, during the consultation on the improvements to the system needs study methodology, and of course during the consultation on the draft TYNDP 2026. These events, and other to be confirmed, will be announced on TYNDP website and in ENTSO-E's weekly newsletter.

Where to find information about projects present in TYNDP 2026?

Information will be available in due time, first with the draft list of projects in Q1 2026, then in the online project sheets in Q4 2026.

What exactly is the promoter's Single Point of Contact?

The Single Point of Contact (SPOC) is the contact person for each project, who is responsible to receive communications from ENTSO-E for all promoters of that project.

What if a project promoter wishes to remove his/her project from TYNDP 2026?

The project promoter should inform ENTSO-E SPOC (ytyndp@entsoe.eu) if they wish to remove a project from TYNDP 2026.
